SECRECY OF MESSAGES

1. The licensee shall not divulge to any person (other than the properly authorized officials of the Government or a competent legal tribunal) or make any use whatever of any message coming to the knowledge of the licensee and not intended for receipt by means of the licensed apparatus.

This does not apply to broadcasted concerts or programmes addressed to the General Public.

Regulation 105: Any person who violates any of the provisions of these regulations shall be liable on summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding fifty dollars and costs or three months imprisonment.

NOTICE

Irregular working and infractions of the radio regulations by transmitting stations should be immediately reported to the Director of Radio, Department of Marine and Fisheries, Ottawa.

When using a receiver of the regenerative type for the reception of radio-telephone programmes, please avoid increasing regeneration to the point at which the receiver begins to oscillate, otherwise you will cause interference with neighbouring receiving equipments.
